Breaking News! A First in Canada!

CHES has responded proactively to reports by educators, parents, and students of Ottawa and Kingston high schools <u>being targeted by online</u> harassment and antisemitic abuse connected directly to events in Israel in May 2021. <u>To help students and educators feel safe</u> CHES took the initiative in bringing these important conversations into public schools within the Ottawa Carleton District School Board.

In collaboration with the Equity and Diversity team at the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board, CHES has created *Unpacking Complexity in the Classroom*, a unique program to help educators better understand antisemitism. *Unpacking Complexity* is an exceptional examination of antisemitism today. It is designed to educate educators on how to deal with sensitive issues that affect their schools and their students and will be offered in three sessions this spring. CHES is honoured to bring this remarkable experience to teachers in Ottawa.
