6/11/06 Dear Zoly, It will be easier for me to tell you in my own words what lexperienced during the Holocaust than to correct your account of it. Uscoures this is sixty two years later. I was born in 1929. At that time it was Romania and as young as I was, I was aware of the antisemitism. The Hungarians occupide that part of Europe in 1940 or 1941. The antisemitism was as bad if not worse. I think Jan. or Feb. the Germans occupide Sighet in 1944. First we were not permited to be in the streets at certain hours, then we had to wear the yello Jewish star of David. That year the last day of Passover they announced the Jews will not be permited to leave their houses. If few days later we were ordered into the gheto. There was four ghetos in Sighet. We had to leave our house because it was not included in the gheto. We moved into your tathers house accross the street. We were tire families in a two room house, 22 people. Jince it was April and May the boys

slept in the wood shad; Benezy, Sruelldo, Bumi and the other two boy's that were with us in the gheto. After being in the gheto for about five weeks early one morning we all were ordered to line up in the street without any previous notice We were in the burning Sun from day break to dusk when they finally started marching us into one of the temples in Sighet, that was after surching us for value bels. In the Temple we were packed in like sardins, most of us did not even have room to sit. Ofcourse with so many people and babys crying nobody was even able to dose of. After that long night, again at day break they marched we us to the train station and crowded us into cattle cars from 60 to 90 people in one cattle car. That was May 19/1994 in a Friday, We arrived at day break to Huschwitz May 22 nd. Zoly Huschwitz was not a labor camp it was an extermination camp When we arrived at Auschwitz, they chased

us off the train and separated the woman from the man without giving us a chance to say goodby to our loved ones. We were ordered to form a line and Mengele pointed who should go to the left and who to the right. My mother was sent to left. all those that went to the left were gased that same day, your grandmother, your aunt with her three little boys also went to the left. We did not know at the time about gas chambers or crematoriums. We were told that all the familys will wo visit together every Sunday. They marched us to the baths, where we had to get undressed completely and whatever we had, had to be dumpt on a pile even the clothing that we took off. They cut our hair and when we came out of the showers they gave us junky uniforms, We were marched to Husehwits Bearcano and that was the begining we had to line up, out of 1500 woman they

selected two hundred tifty to send to a labor

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camp. Your two ounts Chancy, I and your mother were counted into the 2500. They sent us to Mildorf Dachau. Zoly dear, I would have to write a book to _ you, which Idon't have the time to do nor the ability. I did make a tape of the Show in 1996 which your father sow in my house. All I can tell is that whole families were whiped out, if not from the very begining than during the years of the Holocaust. Both from my fathers side and my mothers side five families were whiped out completely. I don't even remember their last names. lost ofleased 150 relitives and friends. We were liberated in the dead march in the train by the americans in April 1945 I hope this will be helpfull to Brian and to you. Give my love to the entire family
