



















◆ **Anti-Jewish measures: January 1942–February 1945**

 <p>January 1942 Jews were forced to hand over furs and woollen clothing</p>	 <p>24 April 1942 The use of public transport by Jews was prohibited</p>	 <p>11 July 1942 Berlin Jews directly deported to the extermination camp at Auschwitz</p>
 <p>14 February 1942 Bakers were forbidden to sell cakes to Jews and Poles</p>	 <p>15 May 1942 Jews were no longer allowed to keep pets</p>	 <p>7 August 1942 Poles and Jews were forbidden to give evidence in court against Germans</p>
 <p>17 February 1942 Jews were not allowed to buy newspapers and magazines</p>	 <p>11 June 1942 Jews were no longer allowed to receive cigarettes or cigars</p>	 <p>18 September 1942 The supply of meat, meat products and other rationed groceries to Jews was discontinued</p>
 <p>26 February 1942 Jews were forbidden to use ticket machines</p>	 <p>20 June 1942 All schools were closed to Jewish children</p>	 <p>9 October 1942 Jews were no longer allowed to buy books</p>
 <p>24 March 1942 Jews were only allowed to use public transport if their workplace was more than seven km from their home</p>	 <p>22 June 1942 Jews were no longer allowed to buy eggs</p>	 <p>26 March 1943 Organised arrests for deportation took place at Jewish workplaces</p>
 <p>26 March 1942 All Jewish residences were to be marked with the Star of David</p>	 <p>10 July 1942 Jews were no longer allowed to have fresh milk</p>	 <p>16 February 1945 Files dealing with anti-Jewish activities were destroyed</p>
